Budget Season Commences

On September 27, the County Executive presented his Recommended 2013 Budget, available <u>here</u>. He expressed his goals to chip away at the list of deferred maintenance in our parks, maintain the most needed services and freeze taxes.

Although County Executive Abele noted that transit and paratransit service remains intact without raising fares, a funding crisis looms in 2014.

We will spend all of October reviewing these budget proposals. The Finance, Personnel & Audit Committee will consider the recommendations and make amendments, beginning on October 8. I will closely follow these budget hearings and offer suggestions. The <u>budget hearing schedule</u> may be updated as needed. You are welcome to attend budget hearings in Room 203-R of the Milwaukee County Courthouse or watch live hearings online.

I would like to know your thoughts on funding services in the 2013 Budget. The County Board will hold a public hearing on the budget on Monday, October 29, at 6:30 p.m. at the Bradley Pavilion of the Marcus Center for the Performing Arts (929 N. Water Street, Milwaukee). Board Clarifies Land Sale Procedures

I am pleased that the Board has reached a compromise with the County Executive's office on creating a land sales resolution and ordinance. On a vote of 13 to 5, the

Milwaukee County Board approved this new County ordinance, establishing a clear policy on land sales and arriving at compromise. The compromise makes it clear that the County Executive's office and economic development staff will conduct the hard work of negotiations for creating development agreements.

Together, with the County Board setting the policy on real estate sales and with the County Executive's office doing the detailed work of negotiations, Milwaukee County is poised to move toward productive economic development agreements.

I would like to thank my colleagues and the County Executive. Our constituents expect us to work together in accomplishing Milwaukee County land sales. We did just that.

While some technology challenges still must be resolved, already many County residents are able to view the Board's meetings from their home computers. I am glad that my constituents will be able to take advantage of this new level of engagement in the legislative process. Proposal to Contract Park Patrol

Law enforcement in our County parks has traditionally been provided by the Sheriff's Department and his Targeted Enforcement Unit. County Executive Abele and Mayor Barrett recently announced a proposal for Milwaukee County to contract out park patrol, with the Milwaukee Police Department receiving \$1.6 million in exchange for policing County parks in the City of Milwaukee and the Lakefront and with the suburban police departments receiving a total of \$125,000 to patrol County parks in the suburbs.

I have expressed great concern about this idea. Supervisory District 8 contains four lakeshore parks and other popular parks. When negative activities are eliminated from Bradford Beach, the problems often travel to our lakeshore parks. We have already seen bad activities at Grant Park, particularly in the Seven Bridges. The Sheriff's park patrol is already understaffed and relying on the suburban police departments. Our communities do not have the resources to assume additional patrol duties. I would hope that the authors would rethink their proposal.

Grant Park Roadway

Grant Park Drive was partially closed for reconstruction this summer. After several setbacks including rain and poor subsoil, the roadway has now been reopened to traffic.

Greene Park

In response to a complaint about sewer gas odor in Greene Park, I communicated with the Milwaukee County Parks Department. Staff found that an air release needed to be repaired. On September 13, St. Francis and MMSD worked in Greene Park to address the sewer gas odor since both agencies have pipes there. In the past, I remember that we had similar problems and the charcoal filter had to be replaced.

The contractor for the parking lot at Greene Park was able to locate the stop sign in storage. The sign has now been restored to the parking lot exit.

Weed-outs

Our local park friends groups are hosting two opportunities to control glossy buckthorn and non-native honeysuckle. On Saturday, October 6, volunteers can meet in Grant Park at <u>the parking lot near the tennis courts and Area 1</u>. They will proceed to a location east of Grant Golf Course to clip invasive buckthorn and apply herbicide from 9 a.m. to Noon or 1 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Tools and gloves will be provided.

Also on October 6, the Sheridan Park Friends invite the community to gather at the Sheridan Pavilion (<u>Area 1</u>) for a 9:30 a.m. meeting. At 10:30 a.m., participants will proceed to treat invasive plants east of Sheridan Park Pool and just south of the service yard. Supplies and training will be provided by Jim Goulee of The Park People.

Recognizing Former Parks Director

At the September County Board meeting, the Board honored Sue Black for her service to the County. Sue participated in the Pedal in the Park event last June. She visited our local parks throughout the South Shore to periodically monitor improvements and to support activities in our parks. We all wish Sue well in her new endeavors. She will be missed.
