WHEREAS; the manufacturing industry employs more than 466,000 Wisconsinites, accounts for 18 percent of gross domestic product, and contributes over \$59 billion to Wisconsin's economic growth; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin has invested heavily in programs that connect job seekers to employment in the Wisconsin manufacturing sector, or training programs that lead to good-paying jobs in manufacturing, such as Youth and Registered Apprenticeship, Wisconsin Fast Forward, Fab Labs, and more; and

WHEREAS; the manufacturing industry in Wisconsin continues to grow at a high rate, with Wisconsin consistently ranking in the top 10 among states in manufacturing jobs added, which pay an average annual wage of over \$57,000, and nearly \$10,000 more than the average wage for all private sector workers; and

WHEREAS; throughout 2017, manufacturing workers in Wisconsin earned a total of \$26.5 billion in wages, the state's manufacturing job concentration was 89 percent above the national average, and the state's manufacturing industry represented 93 percent of the state's exports, generating almost \$21 billion in revenue from outside the state; and

WHEREAS; state cabinet agencies, as well as the Wisconsin Technical College System, Wisconsin Manufacturers & Commerce, and other stakeholders, come together to plan and promote the month's events;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim Friday, October 5, 2018 as

MANUFACTURING DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.
