NARRATIVE

Disorderly Conduct:

On 09/17/2020 around 6:00 PM, several individuals gathered at the Wauwatosa City Hall, 7725 W. North Ave. This group meet was organized by Khalil Coleman, B/M, 07/03/1986. Coleman called for community members of Milwaukee County to meet at the Wauwatosa City Hall while he hosted the Police & Fire Commission meeting that was scheduled in Wauwatosa that evening at 6:00 PM.

By 7:05 PM, this event was no longer a peaceful meeting, but was now disorderly and causing a disturbance. The first logged complaint was called into the Wauwatosa Dispatch Center at 7:05 PM for loud and inappropriate language being used at this event. Five minutes later, at 7:10 PM, a second complaint was received by the Wauwatosa Dispatch Center from the 8100 block of Aberdeen Ct., which is approximately a half of a mile away from City Hall. This complaint was also for loud music and inappropriate language. At 7:11 PM, a third call for the same and a minute later, a fourth. Due to the wave of calls coming into dispatch suddenly and to keep the dispatchers available for 911 calls and emergency radio traffic, all subsequent complaints from this group at City Hall were handled by the front desk clerks at the Wauwatosa Police Department. The two clerks estimated by the end of the evening that they handled approximately 50 calls from citizens complaining about the inappropriate noise level and language coming from this group that gathered at City Hall.

I responded to the area to monitor the group and could easily hear vulgar and inappropriate language, including different variations of "fuck" being magnified over normally peaceful Wauwatosa neighborhoods, piercing the ears of young children that could hear these lyrics.

Background:

This group, self proclaimed as "The People's Revolution" has become increasingly disorderly, agitated, and at times, violent. In the early month of August, it was this same group that went to Officer Mensah's personal residence and a participant of this group brought a shotgun with them. This shotgun was discharged toward Officer Mensah and struck Officer Mensah's residence. This was the same evening that this group broke windows and toilet papered Officer Mensah's residence.

More recent, this group has gone face to face with police in front of the Mayor's residence, has intentionally shined lights into officers' eyes in an attempt to disorient police, and on the evening of 09/02/20, one participant threw a full water bottle at police after Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) was used on the agitator (20-16398). During the evening of 09/05/2020, this group again returned to Wauwatosa, but this time in an illegal cruising parade through the City

(20-16561), where vehicles occupied both sides of the roadway, while honking horns and while participants hung out of vehicle windows. When police intervened in the illegal activity, vehicles ran over curbs and onto sidewalks to avoid police and drove the wrong way on N. Mayfair Rd.

To date, this group has brought unlawful, disorderly, and illegal assemblies and activity to the City of Wauwatosa 55 times since May 29th, 2020. Tonight was the 56th such event.

Obstructing Public Thoroughfares:

As in times past, this group left City Hall at approximately 8:11 PM, where the group blocked and obstructed the lawful use of W. North Ave. in the 7800 block. The group was estimated to be 30 vehicles and 50 individuals on foot, blocking the entire roadway. This group traveled west on W. North Ave., to north on N. 80th St., where they circled the eastern edge of the Pasadena Neighborhood and left the City of Wauwatosa at 8:31 PM, northbound on N. 80th St. from W. Center St.

Unlawful Assembly:

-My body-worn camera activated-

The Wauwatosa Police Department continued to monitor this group as it reentered the City on Lefeber Ave., southbound from W. Center St. The group was still a mixture of cars and people on foot, and was still blocking and obstructing the lawful use of public thoroughfares, in violation of Wisconsin State Statute 947.06(2). At this point, myself and two other squads turned N/B onto Lefeber Ave. from W. Clarke St., drove slowly down the roadway, where I utilized the PA on my squad and at 9:00 PM, I announced and declared the following:

First Declaration:

"The Wauwatosa Police Department is declaring this gathering as an unlawful assembly under Wisconsin State Statute 947.06. You have three minutes to vacate the area by exiting eastbound on Center St. If you fail to leave within three minutes, you will all be subject to arrest."

After making this announcement, it was abundantly clear that the announcement was heard, as several residents were coming out of their houses and the participants on foot stopped walking toward the squads and paused. After a short period of time, the vehicles in the group began to utilize the alley on the south side of W. Center St. to avoid the police. The vehicles eventually returned to W. Center St. The participants on foot, however, ignored my lawful order and began to walk southbound on Lefeber Ave. toward my squad. I told dispatch to advise me when three minutes had elapsed. Dispatch advised me after three minutes elapsed. At that time, with the group within 100 feet of my squad, I again declared the following over the PA in my squad at 9:03 PM:

Second Declaration:

"The Wauwatosa Police Department is declaring this gathering an unlawful assembly under Wisconsin State Statute 947.06. You have no more time. You need to vacate the premise immediately. If you fail to leave, you will all be subject to arrest. Again, the Wauwatosa Police Department is declaring this gathering as an unlawful assembly under Wisconsin State Statute 947.06. You must vacate the area now. Everybody here is subject to arrest."

Unlawful Assembly Continues:

The group ignored the lawful order I gave them and continued to walk down the middle of the street in the 2600 block of Lefeber Ave. toward my squad. I re-positioned my squad so I would not get surrounded by the group and stopped at W. Clarke St. and N. 72nd St. as the group walked eastbound on W. Clarke St. At 9:06 PM, as the group approached me again, I again declared the assembly unlawful and ordered the group to disperse by stating over the PA of my squad:

"The Wauwatosa Police Department is declaring this gathering an unlawful assembly under Wisconsin State Statute 947.06. You must turn north and get to Center St. and leave the area. If you do not, you are subject to arrest. The Wauwatosa Police Department is declaring this gathering as an unlawful assembly under Wisconsin State Statute 947.06. You must vacate the area. If you do not, you are all subject to arrest."

After this third declaration, the group continued to ignore the lawful order as they continued to block and obstruct the lawful use of the public thoroughfare.

Suspect Identities:

While on scene and after reviewing squad and body camera video, two of the participants of this group were identified through previous contacts and recognition. Khalil Coleman, as well as David F. Bowen, B/M, 01/28/87 were both identified as participants, who disobeyed the lawful dispersal order, who violated Wisconsin State Statute 947.06.

Coleman is seen on video wearing jeans, a navy blue jacket, a reflective yellow vest, and carrying and speaking into a bull horn.

Bowen is seen on video wearing maroon pants, a gray jacket, and a blue collared shirt with a white colored horizontal stripe across the chest.

Charge Referral:

Based on all of the information described in detail above, as well as the blatant

NARRATIVE

On 09-17-2020 at approximately $9:08 \, \text{pm}$ I, PO Evan Olson, was assisting with an unlawful assembly and traffic enforcement in the area of N. 70th St. and W. Clarke St. Immediately prior, at approximately $9:06 \, \text{pm}$, Sgt. Svatek provided a third unlawful assembly order to the vehicles and individuals in the area. Please reference his incident report for details.

Sgt. Svatek requested that squads identify suspects for future violation enforcement. I observed a group of approximately twenty subjects on foot walking eastbound in the 7000 block of W. Clarke St. They were obstructing vehicle traffic due to blocking the entire roadway.

I identified two of the subjects as David BOWEN (MB 01-28-1987) and Jacob A. PICK (MW 09-05-1991). Both BOWEN and PICK were in the middle of the roadway obstructing traffic while walking eastbound in the 7000 block of W. Clarke St. BOWEN was not wearing a mask and was observed wearing red pants and a dark blue shirt. I have observed BOWEN on several occasions in person and in the media.

PICK was wearing a green sweatshirt and dark colored shorts. I also have observed PICK on several occasions in person and on social media. PICK is approximately 6'03" and 215lbs. PICK also has a unique hair style and color. This incident was captured on my in squad video camera system and stored to the department's secured server.
