- SUBJECT: Municipal penalties for marijuana possession

Per your request, this memorandum lists the penalties for marijuana possession in the 19 Milwaukee County municipalities (see table 1). It also provides the total amount collected by each municipality in marijuana possession forfeitures over the past five years (see table 2).

Note that most municipalities in Milwaukee County have not established set forfeiture amounts for marijuana possession. Instead, municipal codes generally impose a wide forfeiture range, plus court costs, that applies to various ordinance violations, including possession of marijuana under 25 grams. For this reason, the estimates provided in table two are presented as wide ranges. More precise totals have been requested from each municipality and are also included in table 2.
