THE BELOW NAMED COMPLAINANT BEING DULY SWORN, ON INFORMATION AND BELIEF STATES THAT:

Count 1: FIRST DEGREE RECKLESS HOMICIDE

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, December 24, 2022, at 1325 South 29th Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, did recklessly cause the death of ST-B, another human being, under circumstances which showed utter disregard for human life, contrary to sec. 940.02(1), 939.50(3)(b) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class B Felony, the defendant may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not to exceed sixty (60) years.

Count 2: FIRST DEGREE RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING SAFETY

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, December 24, 2022, at 1325 South 29th Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, did recklessly endanger the safety of JPV, under circumstances which show utter disregard for human life, contrary to sec. 941.30(1), 939.50(3)(f) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class F Felony, the defendant may be fined not more than Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), or imprisoned not more than twelve (12) years and six (6) months, or both.

Count 3: FIRST DEGREE RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING SAFETY

The above-named defendant on or about Saturday, December 24, 2022, at 1325 South 29th Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, did recklessly endanger the safety of JJV, under circumstances which show utter disregard for human life, contrary to sec. 941.30(1), 939.50(3)(f) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class F Felony, the defendant may be fined not more than Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), or imprisoned not more than twelve (12) years and six (6) months, or both.

Probable Cause:

On December 24, 2022, at 6:59 p.m., Milwaukee Police Officers Joran Bryant and Nicolas Romeo were dispatched to S. Layton Blvd. and W. Greenfield Ave., City of Milwaukee, regarding a shooting call. Information provided was that there was a car collision following the shooting.

Upon their arrival, the officers saw a gray Acura SUV on the southwest corner of W. Greenfield Ave. and S. Layton Blvd. This vehicle had front end damage. The officers also saw a gray Toyota RAV4 on the west side of S. Layton Blvd. The officers approached the Acura SUV and saw a handgun on the passenger's side floorboard. The officers were directed to a male who was at the location as being the front-seat passenger. Officer Bryant went to the male and that male identified himself as JPV. JPV, an adult male, stated that he had been the front passenger in the vehicle and that the handgun belonged to him.

Officer Romeo and Officer Kobe Mossman were able to pull the driver of the Acura out of the vehicle. The driver was later identified as ST-B, an adult female. Offer Romeo saw that ST-B was not conscious and was not breathing. Officer Romeo began CPR until the arrival of Milwaukee Fire Department personnel who provided medical assistance to ST-B. ST-B, while at the scene, was pronounced deceased.

Forensic Investigator Madeline Baumeister of the Milwaukee County Medical Examiner's Office arrived at the scene and conducted a preliminary examination of the body of ST-B. During that investigation, F.I. Baumeister located a suspected gunshot wound to the left flank. The body of STB was transported to the office of the Milwaukee County Medical Examiner for an autopsy.

On December 26, 2022, and autopsy was performed on the body of ST-B. The autopsy was performed by Dr. Brian Linert. During that autopsy, Dr. Linert observed that ST-B had sustained a single gunshot wound, to her left side/upper back. Dr. Linert determined that the bullet was fired from an indeterminate range; the path of the bullet was from back to front, left to right, and upward. The bullet travelled through the left lung, nicked the back of the heart, went through the right lung, and was recovered inside the chest cavity. Dr. Linert determined that the cause of death was the gunshot wound and ruled the manner of death to be Homicide.

Officer Romeo also saw that in the back seat of the Acura was a juvenile male, subsequently identified as JJV.

JPV was subsequently interviewed by Milwaukee Police Detectives Travis Jung and Curtis Pelczynski. During that interview, JPV provided the following information regarding this shooting:

- 1. On December 24th, he had some errands to run with ST-B. He contacted his sister and asked her to watch his son, J.V. His sister lives with his mom and step-dad in the 1200 block of S. 30th St, Milwaukee.
- 2. After dropping off his son, he and ST-B ran errands, and they then returned to his mother's house to pick up his son. He went inside while ST-B remained in the car.
- 3. He got into the car and they then drove on S. 30th St. to Greenfield, and then turned east on Greenfield Ave.
- 4. About 2-3 seconds after turning onto W. Greenfield Ave, he heard rapid gunfire. He estimates that he heard 5 gunshots. He did not see who was shooting.
- 5. He then asked ST-B what was wrong. She was saying his name and was spitting up blood. He told ST-B to pull over, but ST-B was not able to do so, so he put the car into park, causing their car to slide into another vehicle.

- 6. He was then panicking, his son was screaming, and he couldn't get the door open. He tried unlocking the doors, but the doors wouldn't lock. He then took out his gun, shot out the passenger's side window, pushed out the glass, and jumped out the window.
- 7. He got his son out of the car, and then he went to ST-B and saw that the driver's door had a bullet hole near the door handle. He then saw that ST-B had a gunshot wound to her left side/back area.

During the investigation of this homicide, Det. Michael Flannery spoke with J.M, an adult female. J.M. provided the following information regarding this shooting:

- 1. She was standing on the porch of a residence in the 1300 block of S. 29th St.
- 2. While there, she saw a silver vehicle, which she believed to be an older model Nissan Altima, travel from the west, down the alley, and slide out of the mouth of the alley. This vehicle almost hit a parked vehicle.
- 3. She then looked away, and she then heard 10-15 gunshots.
- 4. She looked over to where she had seen the Nissan and saw a male hanging out of the front passenger's door. This person was armed with a black handgun and was pointing the gun to the south.

During the investigation of this homicide, Det. Flannery spoke with J.T. the brother of ST-B. During that interview, he said that ST-B, his sister, and JPV have been together for about 8 years and they have a son together.

Milwaukee Police Det. Brian Maciejewski responded to the scene of this shooting. Det. Maciejewski was responsible for the scene investigation. In conducting that investigation, Det. Maciejewski observed the following:

- 1. Eleven (11) Cartridge casings were located and recovered in the 1300 block of S. 29th St.
- 2. SB-T's vehicle was on the southwest corner of S. 27th St. and W. Greenfield Ave.
- 3. Between S. 29th St. and S. 30th St., there is a T-alley. The alley can be accessed from S. 30th St., from S. 29th St. and from W. Scott St.
- 4. The front windshield of the Ford Ranger pickup, parked to the south of S. 29th St. and W Greenfield Ave., had been struck by a bullet. The position of this vehicle and the location of the bullet strike is consistent with a bullet travelling from the north.
- 5. The vehicle which S.T.B. had been driving, had a bullet strike directly behind the driver's side front door handle. The bullet had penetrated the driver's side door of the vehicle.

On December 31, 2022, Milwaukee Police Dets. Timothy Keller and Rachel Smith were assigned to conduct follow-up investigation in regard to this homicide. The detectives were assigned to investigated shots fired in the area, just prior to the homicide. The detectives went to Scott Beer and Food, 1201 S. 33rd St., and at that location they recovered five-9mm cartridge casings on the sidewalk, just outside of the store.

Testing of the casings recovered by Dets. Keller and Smith on December 31, 2022, and the casings recovered by Det. Maciejewski on December 24, 2022, (as described above) was done by Milwaukee Police Officer Daniel Urban. Officer Urban is assigned to the Fusion Division as a Forensic Technology Certified IBIS Technician. Based upon this testing, it is his opinion that the casings from these two locations were fired from the same firearm.

On January 1, 2023, Milwaukee Police Detectives Michael Braunreiter and Rachel Smith were reviewing surveillance video recovered from 1201 S. 33rd St., Milwaukee. The recovered video was from December 24th, 2022. Also viewing the video were Police Officer Miguel Benitez and

Det. Ryan Casey. The video shows a person, wearing red pants and a purple hooded seater. enter into the driver's seat of a silver Ford Taurus. Officer Benitez and Det. Casey recognized this person as Raymond King (12/27/2004), a person with whom they have had numerous contacts. The video also shows a person, wearing a black t-shirt, black baseball hat and gray pants, who is armed with a black handgun. This person got out, from the passenger's side, of the Ford Taurus that King was seen entering. Officer Benitez and Det. Casey recognized this person as Omarion Danielson, Defendant, a person with whom they have had numerous contacts. Officer Benitez told Det. Braunreiter that he believed that Danielson was currently on supervision with the Wisconsin Department of Corrections, and that his supervision included GPS monitoring. Det. Braunreiter then contacted the Dept. of Corrections and was informed that Danielson was on supervision with GPS monitoring. Det. Braunreiter was provided with the GPS points for Danielson on December 24, 2022. Det. Braunreiter reviewed the GPS points and those show that Danielson was near 33rd and Scott St., at approximately 6:49 p.m. on December 24, 2022. The GPS points then show Danielson travelling through the neighborhood, travelling 27 mph. The GPS points show Danielson at 1221 S. 29th St. at 6:51 p.m., travelling 13 mph.

On January 3rd, 2023, Milwaukee Police Dets. Curtis Pelczynski and Travis Jung interviewed Omarion Danielson, Defendant. (Danielson had previously been interviewed and during that interview he has said that he had, on December 24, 2022, been in possession of a firearm and that he had been shooting that firearm at a Nissan, in the area of S. 33rd St. and W Scott St.) During the interview by Dets. Jung and Pelczynski Danielson provided the following information regarding December 24, 2022:

- 1. He would not speak about who he was with and would only speak about himself.
- 2. He went to the corner store on S. 33rd and W. Scott. When he got there, he got out of the car and he had his gun with him.
- 3. When he entered the store, with his gun in his hand, someone in the store said to him what the fuck are you looking at, or words to that effect.
- 4. He walked up to the person and said Who are you talking to. The person put his hands up and said you got it. Three people then put their items down and walked out of the store. These three got into a car and started to drive away from the area.
- 5. As they were driving away, he shot at the vehicle they were in. He fired two shots.
- 6. The occupant of the vehicle then fired back at him, firing four times.
- 7. He then fired two more shots at the vehicle.
- 8. He then got into the front passenger's seat and they went to Bay View to get pizza.
- 9. When shown pictures recovered from surveillance video, he said that the vehicle he was in was a Ford Taurus. He was the front seat passenger, but he would not say whose vehicle it was.
- 10. After being shown additional pictures and being informed that the person who died was on her way to celebrate Christmas with her family and that her 7 year-old son was in the back seat of her car, Danielson said that he would tell what happened.
- 11. Danielson said that everything he has said about the first incident (the incident at the store on S. 33rd and W. Scott St.) was the truth.
- 12. He said long story short, they saw the Nissan (a vehicle depicted in some of the pictures he was shown), and he figured there were a lot of people in the car, so he shot. When he shot, he assumed he was going to hit one of them. He shot ten (10) times from the vehicle he was in. He was aiming at the car (the Nissan).
- 13. He stated that the homicide occurred on the corner of S. 29th St. and W. Greenfield Ave., and he learned about it from the news.
- 14. He said that when the Nissan turned left on Greenfield, he was shooting out of the vehicle window.

15. He stated that they weren't looking for the Nissan, but when it came out of the alley in front of them, he knew they had a gun, and he wasn't going to let them shoot him. He said that the occupants of the Nissan did not shoot at him during the second incident. He said he wasn't really aiming, it was dark, and he couldn't see anything.

16. He said that he didn't mean to kill the lady.
