57th Shamrock Club of Wisconsin St. Patrick's Day Parade returns Saturday, March 15

MILWAUKEE – Milwaukee's largest St. Patrick's Day celebration, the 57th Shamrock Club of Wisconsin St. Patrick's Day Parade, returns to downtown Milwaukee on Saturday, March 15 at noon. Presented by Miller Lite, the Parade steps off at North Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive and West Wisconsin Avenue and travels through downtown's entertainment districts, ending on North Water Street at Highland Avenue.

Following the Parade, the festivities continue at the Shamrock Club's Post-Parade Party at the Irish Cultural & Heritage Center (2133 W Wisconsin Ave.) from 2 to 6 p.m. Guests can expect performances from several of Milwaukee's Irish dance schools, live music, traditional Irish fare and a super raffle.
